

## Primary School PE & Sports Premium Statement

Schools receive PE & Sport Premium funding based on the number of eligible pupils in Year 1 to 6. In most cases, the amount received is determined by how many pupils at the Academy attract the funding using data from the January school census. For the academic year 2013-14, the school did not have any eligible pupils and therefore did not receive the PE and Sport Premium funding. However, the school allocated funding for all reception children to engage in high quality sporting activities to encourage and develop healthy lifestyle choices from the very start.

This academic year, the Academy has 25 eligible pupils and as such will receive £8,125 to enhance provision which is made up of a lump sum of £8,000 with the additional funding of £5 per eligible pupil). All schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of PE and sport activities they offer to pupils but they are free to choose the best way of using the funds.

For example, funds could be used to:

Hire specialist PE coaches

Hire qualified coaches to work alongside teachers

Provide resources to support the teaching of PE and sport

Support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs

Run sports competitions or increase participation in School Games

Run sports activities with other schools

### Our story so far.

- The extended school day at St Martin's allows for an enhanced sports curriculum to be offered to all children within normal school hours. This enables every child the opportunity to try a wide range of sports and physical activity, working with a variety of sports coaches and still not having to stay for additional extra-curricular clubs.
- Throughout Year 1, the range and opportunity for additional sports beyond the school day increases and every child is able to access extra-curricular clubs at some point in the school year. The Year 1 clubs are oversubscribed and allow for 60% of the class population to take part in the enhanced provision at any one time.
- The range and frequency of extra activities will increase as the school grows beyond the infant phase.
- A wide variety of PE and sporting activities are taught at St Martin's Academy made possible by the outstanding levels of positive behaviour and safety amongst all students.

Although the school did not receive PE School Sports Premium for the academic year 2013-2014, significant investment was made to ensure that outstanding provision for all pupils was in place including the employment of specialist sports coaches and the provision of swimming lessons for all pupils throughout the year.

We aim to promote the physical wellbeing of our children whilst developing core skills to use across the curriculum.
